THE STAND
BIG BANG
(GOD)

Science continues to seek knowledge regarding the birth of the universe. The latest theory from all such research is the Big Bang Theory, which, unlike many others, seems to hold sway.

With the help of a satellite called the Wilkinson Microwave Anisotropy Probe, the most detailed and precise map thus far has been produced of the universe at its birth, which confirms the Big Bang Theory.
